Rules and Regulations to Implement Executive Order

Purposent to Executive Trior No. 188 cated July 15, 199 entitled "GUIDELINES ON THE ENTRY AND STAY OF FOREIGN STUDENTS IN THE PHILIPPINES AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF MINITER-SECOND TO THE STANDLISHMENT OF THE PROPERTY CONTINUES FOR THE STANDLISHMENT OF THE PROPERTY CONTINUES THE STANDLISHMENT OF THE PROPERTY OF THE P
- 2. It is the policy of the government to promote the Philippines as a hearter for education in the Raia Pacific region by encouraging foreign students to study in the Philippines, developing awareness or the Philippine educational system by neighboring countries, and allowing accepted foreign students to avail themselves of the Pacifities of the Philippine educational institutions.
- 5. Foreign students are alians belonging or owing allegiance to a country other than the hillippines who will study in any educational institution of computed by the government of the Philippines, to contain the containers, and other station of the country of t
 - 4. Any Philippine school whose programs are recognized by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and approved for addission of foreign students by the Commission

on Immigration in accordance with Section 9-f of Commonwealth Act No. 613, as amended by Republic Act Nos. 118, 135, 144, 503, 749 and 827, is hereby authorized to accept foreign students.

5. Such schools may lounch information campaigns to solicit and receive application directly from prospective foreign students. In the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) and the Department of Tourism have been designated to assist the schools for this purpose.

6. Once the applicant is accepted for admission, the school may forward to the applicant the appropriate Notice of Acceptance to the course of study applied for hewever, the school may be required to obtain in advance an appropriate Certificate of Rigitality for Admission (CEA) from the CHED for certain courses of study, such as in medicine and in nursing, where restrictions may exist on the enrollment of foreign students due to a shortage of facilities. Once issued, the CEA shall remain valid for the duration of the course of study, provided the student when the classes and continues to receive satisfactory grades. The classes are courses of studies which have been pre-determined as quarteress shall be regularly published by the CHED in consultation with the different Technical Panels concerned.

7. The CHED shall provide all schools with comparative equivalences for the major foreign educational systems, and should any question concerning equivalences arise, the school concerned shall secure the comments of the CHED before accepting a foreign student for enrollment.

Enrollment in any level shall require completion
of the lower pre-requisite level. For example, an applicant
for the tertiary or collegiate level should be a graduate of
high school or its equivalent.

9. Elementary, secondary and tertiary enrollment in Fhilippine's chools by the spuese and children of the following categories will be treated on the same basis as Philippine nationals: (e) permanent foreign students, (b) aliens with valid working permits. (c) foreign diplomat personnel and (d) personnel from duly accredited personnel from the personnel

10. Issuance of Student Visss. (Section 9 f of the PIA of 1940, as amended)

The -procedure and documentation for the issuance of student visa' shall be kept to a minimum. The applicants for student visa shall submit the following documents to the Philippine Foreign Service Establishments (PFSE) located in the country of their recidency:

- (a) A copy of the Notice of Acceptance from a Philippine school and where applicable, a copy of the Certificate of Eligibility for Admission (CEA);
- (b) Documentary proof of support to cover expenses incidental to their studies, such as board and lodging as well as return air tickets;
- (c) Authenticated scholastic records;
- (d) Authenticated Police Clearance Certificate from the applicant's country of origin or residence;
- (e) Results of medical examinations conducted by an authorized physician; and
- (f) Other documents that may be required in the individual case by the Consular Officer, provided that the shall not be the task of the PFSE determine the applicants scholastic fixes for the program applied for. If all domestary requirements are in order, the PFSE concerned shall issue a student visa.

- (b) It shall be the responsibility of the individual school in which the foreign student is enrolled to report promptly at the close of each state of the close of each state of the close of each state of the school but who failed to gester, these foreign school but who failed to gester, either for the first time or for responsible terms. - (c) Appropriate arrangements shall be made by the agencies concerned for foreigners who are already in the Philippines under other valid

visa arrangements, to facilitate their conversion into student visas, provided all the relevant prerequisites listed herein are complied with.

12. Security Matters.

- (a) The appropriate authorities may check whenever necessary the activities of foreign students brought to its attention, whose activities appear to be inimical to the security of the state. They shall be security of the state. - (b) Those agencies charged with the maintenance of internal security shall undertake steps necessary to safeguard national security interests, without in any way further than the process of application, visa issuance, and the process of application of foreign students in the Philippines.
- 13. For records purposes and for the regular updating of the statistics on foreign students, the schools shall submit the list and student profile of all foreign students enrolled in their respective schools on a semestral or trimester basis, as the case may be.

14. Establishment and Composition of the Committee on Foreign Students. There is hereby created an Inter-Asency Committee on Foreign Students herein referred to as the Committee, which shall have the following members pursuant to E.O. 188 and in the light of the law creating the Commission on Higher Education (8A 7722):

Duties and Responsibilities of the Committee. The Committee shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

(a) Promulgate simplified procedures and implementing guidelines governing the entry and stay of foreign students in the Philippines in accordance with the Provisions of these rules and regulations within sixty (60) days from the effectivity

- (b) Monitor and coordinate the implementation of these rules and regulations by the departments and agencies concerned;
- (c) Meet regularly to assess the progress of the whole program to ensure that the promotion of the Philippines as a center for education in the region is effectively encouraged and undertaken; and
- (d) Request representatives from other agencies and/or the private sector to attend its meetings, when it deems necessary and
