## SUBJECT: POLICY OF PROGRESSIVE DEREGULATION VIS-À-VIS HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS (BEIS)

In accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 77(2), otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1945," and to afford Higher Education Institutions (Highly non-tensory) in the determination of their curricular offerings and students (Highly non-tensory) in the determination of their curricular of the students and their provisions to the students of the students and their provisions and their provisions and their properties deregulation via-avis Itlis is studied a policy of the Commission. Consequently, effective Collegiates (CQ) 1954-1957, the following functions of the Commission are hereby delegated to the VIII concerned to viii.

Issuance of Eligibility for Admission to Higher Education Programs.
Henceforth, the responsibility for and accountability of determining the eligibility of
students for admission to the Law, Medicine and Denistry courses are hereby
transferred to the concerned HEIs provided the following are net and/or observed.
thus:

 a) Law - The applicant-student must be a graduate of a bachelor's degree and must have earned eighteen (18) units of English, six (6) units of 'Mathematics, and eighteen (18) units of Social Science subjects;

b) Medicine - The applicant-student must be a graduate of a backelor's degree and must have earned fifteen (15) units of Biology, ten (10) units of Chemistry, unite (9) units of Mathematics, five (5) units of Physics, and twotwer (12) units of Social Science subjects. The applicant-student should also have talzet and passed the National Medicial Admission Test (MMAT) and

c) Dentistry - The applicant-student must be a graduate of a pridentistry course which should include filteen (13) units of thigher, three (3) units of Mathematics, ten (10) units of Chemistry, three (3) units of Physics. ten (15units of Zoology, five (5) units of Bolany, twelve (12) units of Social Science subjects, nine (9) units of Filipino, and three (3) units of Personal and Community Hygiene.

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- 2. Determination of Course Curriculum. The respective curricula of the courses which HBBs are offering and/or will offer may now be determined by the HBBs themselves, through their respective Deans, without need of the Counsission's approval. However, these curricula must conform with the minimum requirements set by the Commission in its various pertinent issuances. Opies of the curricula tor the different courses, lowever, which HBIs are offering and/or will offer must be adminted to the Higher Education Regional Offices (HBROS) concerned of the Commission a mouth before they are implemented and/or are offered.
- 3. Operation of New Programs. HTGs which have already attained Level III accredited status for Aris, for Sciences, and for three (8) other professional courses are brersby allowed to open and operate new courses in any field without prior approval from the Commission; provided, however, that the Commission (Attention: Office of Brograms and Standards) and is concerned HIRCRy are informed in writing of the opening of these new programs; and provided, furthermore, that the opening of these new programs meet the minimum requirements set by the Commission.

This CMO shall remain in force and effect until otherwise revoked.
