SUBJECT: ASIA-PACIFIC YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS CONFERENCE (AP-VEC)

In accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 7722, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994." and by virtue of Resolution No.

otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994," and by virtue of Resolution No. 001, Series of 1995, of the Commission en bane, all Higher Education Institutions (IEEs) are hereby enjoined and/or directed, thus:

- 1. The Axia-Pacific Young Entrepresours Conference (AP-YEC) which will be held at the New World Hole, Manila on September 2-3, 1996 is a preject of the Philippine government, through its agencies, the Department of Foreign Affairs (Di-A), the National Youth Commission (NYC), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and the private sector, under the assigs of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PCCI). The AP-YEC is being organized in cooperation with the governments of Canada and Indonesia.
- 2. The conference will revolve around the theme "APEC Markete in Motion: Preparing for the 21st Century." The activities include direct business matching, sharing of the most successful enterpreneurial practices in the region, locatures on APEC policies and human resource development, and site visits to factories and industrial zouses which reflect the dynamic investment opportunities in the Philippines. A discussion on the "Brunei Danussalm, Indonesis, Molaysia and the Philippines Land XELNG You'vill Acq (BIMP—EAGA)" will also held to intensity awareness on this new growth polygon in the Asia-Pacific region.
- A registration fee of £2,500 will be charged to cover luncheons, dinners, snacks, business matching, round-table discussions, special events, and industry site visits.
