In a statement, Razon said, the tegration (NCSI) will prepare the corresponding guidelines.

"The amount of P10,000 will be given to any civilian who would be able to invite an active member of a rebel organization Philippines, the New People's Army (NPA), the National Democratic Front (NDF) and the

National Library of the Philippines

Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF), to surface and facilitate their enrollment under the Social Integration Program of the government," he said.

Razon said the SIP "is proving to be a very effective weapon in the fight against insurgency without using guns and bullets."

He said the NPA is now feeling the pinch of the government's SIP, saying that over 800 communist rebels have availed of the program since it was launched in July last year.

diate cash, each rebel-returnee is entitled to a P50,000 capital assistance under the SIP in the form of animals for livelihood, farm implements, and/or sarisari store goods, among others, "to help rebuild their economic and social lives," Malacañang
