Kwok was credited for dramatically reducing corruption when he headed Hong Kong's Independent Commission Against Corruption. Kwok earlier pointed out that negative perceptions have clouded the reality of the country's gains against corruption.

Remonde also continued to defend Mrs. Arroyo's foreign trips, saying the criticisms are coming from opposition leaders seeking publicity for their presidential or senatorial ambitions.

He said he was puzzled by the way opposition Sen. Francis Escudero and Makati City Mayor Jejomar Binay are auestioning the trips.
