The Speaker noted that since the inception of the Rainbow Coalition that included the country's two major parties in 1992, a total of 228 vital economic and social reform laws have been passed. The ensuing Sunshine Coalition of 2001 also involving the two major parties, he stressed, was able to push 911 bills, 17 of which had already nessed the House.

De Venecia stressed that today's event, held at Malacanang's Rizal Hall, was only the start of a series of alliances meant to rally forces behind President Macapagal-Arroyo. He said that in the next few days, it would be the turn of the Liberal and Nacionalista parties as well as some 3,000 Ulamas comprising the largest Muslim group to forge a coalition with Lakas-CMD.
